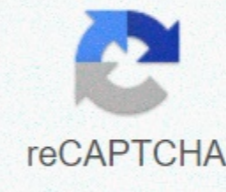

When the president travels on official business, taxpayers cover all air force costs including food, housing and car hire, according to the Congressional Research Service. During official trips, taxpayers also cover travel costs for the President's family and direct staff. The most common example of a political flight on a Force One plane is when the president travels to a destination in his role not as commander-in-chief but as the de facto leader of his political party. This travel will be for fundraising campaigns, election rallies or party events. On the campaign trail, Obama and other presidential candidates also use armored buses costing more than \$1 million each. When Air Force One is used for political purposes, the president often pays for food, housing and travel. The president or his campaign would pay the equivalent of the ticket they would have paid if they had used a commercial airline, according to the Congressional Research Service. According to the Associated Press, although the president or his campaign does not pay for the full cost of Air Force One operation. They pay an amount based on the number of people on board. Taxpayers are still picking up the cost of Secret Service agents and Air Force One. The president, his family and his staff travel on Air Force One for a range of political purposes and officials, they usually reimburse taxpayers for the part of the trip that is considered a campaign. For example, if half of the president's trip is spent raising money for his election or the election of another official, he or his campaign will compensate taxpayers for half the cost of his travel, food and housing. There are grey areas, of course. When they travel and appear openly to defend their political positions, the difference between their official duties and their activities as leaders of their political party can be difficult to assess, according to the Congressional Research Service.
